Yuri Nikolaevich Grigorovich - Soviet and Russian choreographer, ballet-master, dancer, teacher, Merited Artist of the USSR, Knight of the Order of the Holy Apostle Andrew the First-Called and two Orders of Lenin, laureate of the Lenin Prize, two State Prizes of the USSR, the State Prize of the Russian Federation and two awards of the Government of the Russian Federation

 On January 2, 2022, the famous ballet master and choreographer of the Bolshoi Theatre Yuri Grigorovich turns 95. The Bolshoi of Russia celebrates Yuri Grigorovich's anniversary.

The first series of performances in 2022 will begin on January 2 - the great choreographer's birthday - (then January 3, 4, 5, 6) with one of the audience's all-time favourite productions - the New Year ballet Nutcracker.

The Bolshoi is preparing a festival for the anniversary of his birth in January 2022.

• The world premiere of the ballet Master and Margarita continues to attract the attention of the leading media.

"Two leading Moscow theatres - the Bolshoi and the Theatre of Nations - have released their stage versions of Mikhail Bulgakov's novel ... Both performances are likely to become audience hits," suggests the Russian Forbes.

The publication notes «wonderful artists (in the premiere cast, Master - Denis Savin, Margarita - Olga Smirnova)», «the tricks and pranks of Woland's gang: Behemoth (skillfully played by Vyacheslav Lopatin), Woland (Artemy Belyakov), Azazello (Anton Savichev) and Hella (Anna Turazashvili) «, a variety show scene, when «decorous bourgeois spectators turn into extras, cleverly manipulated by the devil ... a hello to Sławomir Mrożek and theatre of absurd, Woland's hypnotic influence on the audience causes mass madness, and in these scenes - like in the Ocean of Solaris - all the horror of modern history collective shamanistic ritual is manifested ..." "One of the ballet's most spectacular moments is that with Margarita, who has lost control and reason, having sipped from the gilded skull of Berlioz, and hangs powerlessly in the hands of Woland-Artemy Belyakov as a soft rag doll" (Satan's Ball: Moscow Theatres Saw Two Premieres of Master and Margarita.)

"It's always a pleasure to watch the prima ballerina Olga Smirnova. She makes every gesture beautiful and meaningful. Although we must admit that few dances have been staged for her and Master (Denis Savin)." The author of the review, Snob editor-in-chief Sergei Nikolaevich tells about the background of Master and Margarita at the Bolshoi, emphasises the link between the choreographer Edward Clug and the avant-garde director Thomas Pandur (1963-2016). The author "is almost sure that Clug conceived his Woland, remembering Thomas Pandur. Black prince, mysterious, private, arrogant. With that demonic smile on his powdered face. This is exactly how Vladislav Lantratov made it. And of course, the best moments of the performance are when Lantratov is dancing the tango."/.../

"Anna Nikulina: "Everyone feels the amazing energy of Grigorovich at once," <u>Teatral</u> publishes the interview. :

"What qualities, in your opinion, distinguish Grigorovich from other choreographers?"

"Yuri Nikolaevich staged his first ballet The Little Stork at the age of 18. How such a young man could stage a three-act ballet remains a mystery to me. A distinctive

feature of Grigorovich is a special perception of ballet: he immediately sees the final result, the whole production. Very few choreographers can feel the entire production. Even we, artists, see only a particular movement, but he sees the whole picture, as if he is watching a performance from the audience ..."

"What does Yuri Nikolaevich pay special attention to during rehearsals?"

"Yuri Nikolaevich is one of the few choreographers who is very sensitive to the choice of costumes. He made many productions together with Simon Virsaladze. They had a wonderful creative tandem. And again, Grigorovich's brilliant ability to see a production, just beginning to emerge, as a whole plays a great role here ..."

• The Bolshoi Ballet prima Olga Smirnova gave a detailed interview to <u>Gazeta.Ru</u> - the article was titled "A ballerina's career is short - it's a shame to waste time on something else." The dancer spoke about the Postscript project programme, the state of modern ballet, the secrets of the ballerina's success and plans for life after the end of her career.

"You dance in three out of four ballets included in the programme. Tell us about them, please."

"While preparing the ballets, we suddenly discovered that all four of them can be united by the theme of a duet - the relationship between man and woman. In each ballet, the couple is placed in different circumstances and context: the Faun and Nymph who emerged from the depths of Nature in Faun, the alien duet in McGregor + Mugler, or two couples placed in social vicissitudes in Alexei Ratmansky's ballet. We close the evening with the ballet Postscript by Paul Lightfoot and Sol León, which gave the project its name. This performance is autobiographical for the directors who are a couple, reflecting a difficult moment of discord in their lives. The ballet is imbued with the theme of loneliness and separation, and the music of Philip Glass is dramatically apt to match the choreography."/.../

"In the spring you said that you dreamed of staging The Idiot to mark the 200th anniversary of Dostoevsky's birth. Is this plan being implemented?"

"In the implementation of The Idiot, I trusted the producer Yuri Baranov and the MuzArts company which have released the Postscript project. Rehearsals are already starting, and we plan to show The Idiot on the stage of the Bolshoi by the summer."/.../

RT in Russian: Bolshoi Ballet prima Olga Smirnova spoke about the Postscript project programme to be premiered on January 11—13.

• The Bolshoi Theatre General Director Vladimir Urin was shortlisted for the Manager of the Year category of the Russian Creative Awards (RCA) - a national award in the field of creative industries, TASS reports. ("The Russian Creative Awards was included in the events of the UN Year of Creative Economy: the contest is held for the first time.") The official awards ceremony where prizes were presented to the laureates took place on December 18 at Zaryadye Concert Hall.

The MusicAeterna orchestra under the direction of Teodor Currentzis (ballet The Firebird by Stravinsky) took part in the ceremony.

The Russian Creative Week directorate, ANO Creative Economy with the support of the Presidential Fund for Cultural Initiatives acted as the organisers of the award.

The contest was held for the first time in 2021.lts task is to identify and support projects with an innovative approach that have had a significant impact on the development of creative industries in Russia, as well as professionals whose initiatives have attracted community and public attention.

The construction of a cultural cluster in Kaliningrad is covered by Russian media.

According to Kultura channel, one of the main objects will be the Bolshoi Theatre branch. The project was developed by Norwegian architects: according to their idea, the theatre will have three zones: public spaces, a stage complex and office premises. The grand hall will have a capacity of 950 seats, the smaller one - 300. On warm days, the roof can become another performance venue. The Bolshoi Theatre branch will not open its doors before 2023.

Kjetil Trædal Thorsen, founder and head of the Norwegian architectural bureau Snøhetta: "The external configuration of the building resembles a ballerina standing in a position. The design will include dancing trees. The whole building seems to be dancing. But the most important thing is acoustics. This is especially true for opera houses, because you perceive the action by ear and eye simultaneously."

Vladimir Urin, the Bolshoi Theatre General Director:» The project will have its own team, its own artistic directors. The ballet company, the opera company, and the orchestra. And I really hope that, first of all, it will become creatively independent. And it will be referred to not as a branch of the Bolshoi, and that is already wonderful, but as the Kaliningrad Opera and Ballet Theatre."






